**Participation Guidelines:** 4-Hers who take more than one clothing project must complete separate learning experiences related to each including creating a separate, total look outfit for EACH project. Members must wear project garment at Clothing Judging. (dressing rooms will be provided) This is so the judge can evaluate the proper fit. Garments will be judged for construction and a construction award will be given.

**Style Revue-** Style Revue is a fashion show that the youth will be able to showcase their outfits during the project judging event. Those interested in participating will need to complete a narration card. This will be provided to you on judging day. If you would like to see a copy of the narration card, please contact the Extension office.

<b>406* Clothes for High School and College</b>	n/a	-Completed Project Book (based on the stated guidelines in the project book) -Pattern and Guide sheet (if used) and records to help explain project accomplishments to the judge -Be prepared to discuss your project with the judge - wear the garment you constructed (minimum of two pieces or a one piece garment with sleeves plus some other style detail not tried before)	If you are selected as a State Fair Delegate – additional information will be given to you by the 4-H Educator
<b>407* Accessories for Teens</b>	n/a	-Completed Project Book (based on the stated guidelines in the project book) -Pattern and Guide sheet (if used) and records to help explain project accomplishments to the judge -Be prepared to discuss your project with the judge - wear at least one accessory you made with the outfit for which you designed it for	If you are selected as a State Fair Delegate – additional information will be given to you by the 4-H Educator
<b>408* Creative Costumes</b>	n/a	-Completed Project Book (based on the stated guidelines in the project book) -Pattern and Guide sheet (if used) and records to help explain project accomplishments to the judge -Be prepared to discuss your project with the judge -wear the costume you made for yourself. You will be judged on the mastery of the project book in addition to the garment constructed. <i>If the project is repeated for multiple years, a new costume category must be selected.</i>	If you are selected as a State Fair Delegate – additional information will be given to you by the 4-H Educator
<b>409* Sew Fun</b>	Junior – 8 to 13 Senior – 14 and up	-Completed Project Book (based on the stated guidelines in the project book) -Pattern and Guide sheet (if used) and records to help explain project accomplishments to the judge -Be prepared to discuss your project with the judge - Wear the garment you made using an “easy” or beginner” pattern (skirt, shorts, pants or capris with a full elastic waistline) You do not need to bring your pin cushion or sewing box to judging. <b>410* Designed by Me</b>	n/a	-Completed Project Book (based on the stated guidelines in the project book) -Pattern and Guide sheet (if used) and records to help explain project accomplishments to the judge -Be prepared to discuss your project with the judge - wear your decorated t-shirt or sweatshirt with the completed outfit you assembled for a total look	If you are selected as a State Fair Delegate – additional information will be given to you by the 4-H Educator
<b>411* em-bel-lish: a 4-H Guide to Wearable Art</b>	n/a	-Completed Project Book (based on the stated guidelines in the project book) -Pattern and Guide sheet (if used) and records to help explain project accomplishments to the judge -Be prepared to discuss your project with the judge - bring the previously made garment or ready to wear garment selected from your wardrobe or a ready to wear garment that you embellished. Select other garments and accessories for a total look outfit. Bring completed activities, Talking It Over pages and completed notebook with at least 3 samples of embellishment	If you are selected as a State Fair Delegate – additional information will be given to you by the 4-H Educator

<b>412* Sew for Others</b>	Junior – 8 to 13 Senior – 14 and up	-Completed Project Book (based on the stated guidelines in the project book) -Pattern and Guide sheet (if used) and records to help explain project accomplishments to the judge -Be prepared to discuss your project with the judge - it is desirable, but required, for the “other” to be present to show an outfit you made at the judging and Style Revue. If the other can not be present, simply bring the garment you made to show the judge and to exhibit in the Style Revue. We limit the number of “others” and outfits to no more than one “other” outfit per entrant. Choose one outfit that best represents your work to the judging event. The outfit should have at least 2 pieces, appropriate for the job, work or an interview (suit, uniform or work outfit)</li> </ul>	If you are selected as a State Fair Delegate – additional information will be given to you by the 4-H Educator
